# **CHS HIGHLIGHTS**



lottesville, as an important host for the International Rescue Committee, is profoundly diverse. More than forty countries from around the globe are represented in our halls. CHS offers a comprehensive curriculum which stresses academics, but includes ample opportunity for students to participate in the study of the visual and performing arts, vocational, and technical fields. Class sizes are small, offering students many opportunities to participate and develop leadership skills. Students are encouraged to take part in a variety of co-curricular activities designed to supplement the core curriculum. More than 65% of Charlottesville High School students participate in extra-curricular activities, choosing from among 55 Virginia High School League (VHSL) sanctioned athletic programs and more than 40 clubs and activities. The band, chorus, orchestra, theatre, and visual arts programs are recognized throughout the Commonwealth of Virginia and have earned the designation "Blue Ribbon School" from the Virginia Music Educators Association. We have earned national recognition in Scholastic Bowl and our BACON (Best All-around Club of Nerds) club.

### 2019-20 School Year

On March 13, 2020, Charlottesville High School transitioned to an all virtual format and remained virtual through the end of the school year. All extracurricular activities were cancelled and the grading scale was adjusted. Please see back page for details

### 2020-21 School Year

Charlottesville High School was in an all virtual format until the start of the 4th quarter when some students returned on a hybrid schedule. All of our sports teams had truncated seasons, between December-June and a limited number of clubs met over zoom starting in April. The typical grading scale was used and grades are included in the cumulative grade point average.
